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2.	 Presentation: Amanda Wallace, Manchester City Galleries Manchester City Galleries is part of MAST (Manchester Arts Sustainability Team). AW gave an overview of how the Gallery has put measures in place to reduce waste, cut energy usage and save money. Measures include: Challenging perceptions of the acceptable parameters collections can be kept in Staff pool bikes, beehives and roof garden Lighting – turning off external lighting, installing LED lighting Staff culture change to ensure that all responsible Turning the off the plant system over night Installing revolving doors to minimise on heat loss The SG was impressed with the amount of work which the Gallery had completed and felt that this best practice should be shared with both visitors and beyond.

5. 6.	 Funding the Future of MACF Funding paper: prepared by KM & JS. Funding is available from MCC for one more year, but after that no guarantees can be made beyond that. Therefore it is important to look to external funding to support the Group. The paper looked at a number of options available, including looking at structural models for group and secretariat support for the emerging thematic subgroups. This will carried forward to the Governance subgroup for consideration. Secretariat support post June 2013 – In June the 2 year contract with Groundwork MSSTT to provide this function will come to an end. Another extension cannot be granted so therefore the work must go out to tender. JS confirmed that there is £20k available for 2013/14.
